



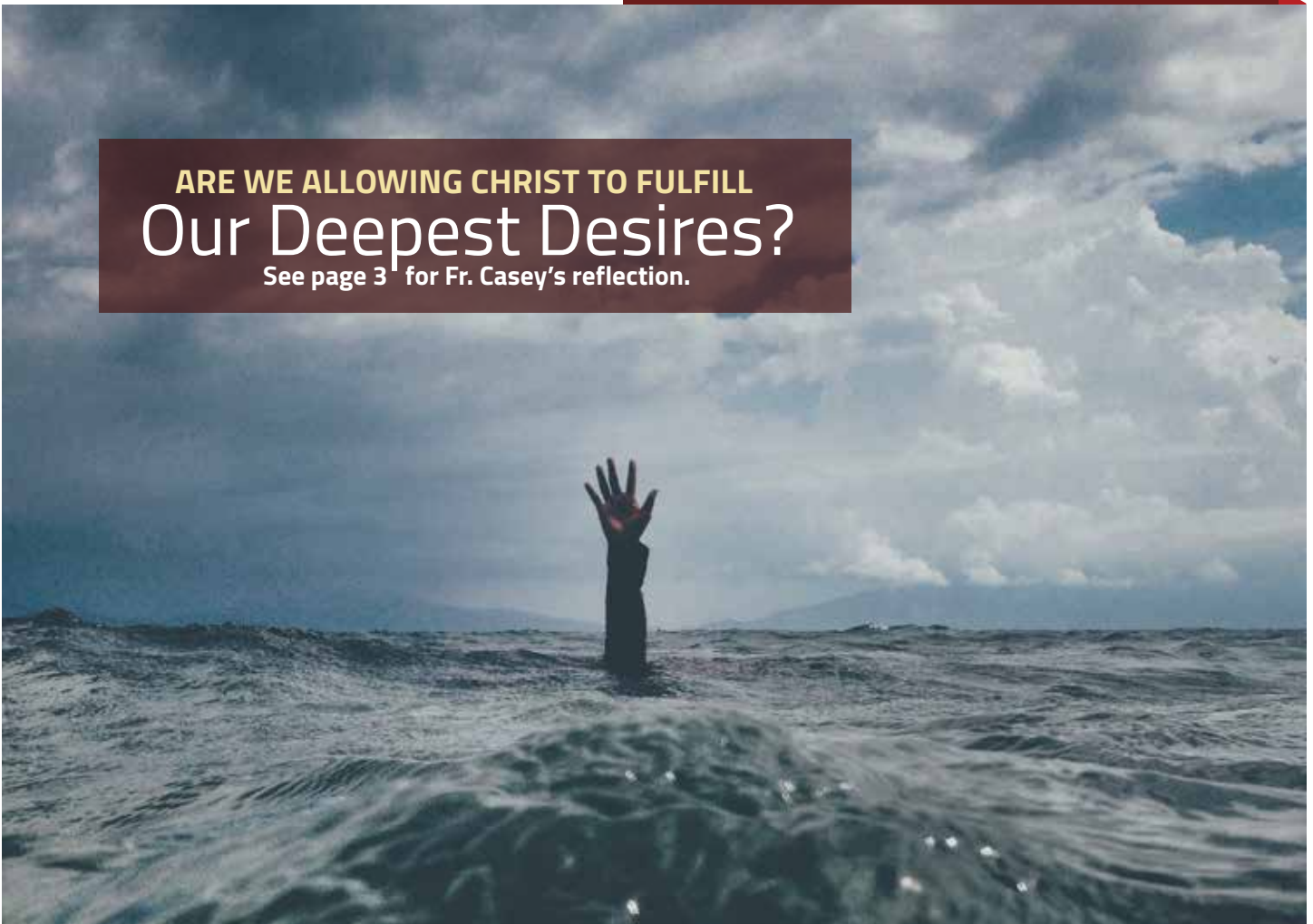

THE DEEPEST LONGINGS OF OUR HEART

Jesus makes the claim in today's Gospel that he is the "fulfillment" of the prophecy of Isaiah. In doing so, Jesus makes known that he is the fulfillment of all the prophets. He is the Christ--he is the messiah. This is made all the more abundantly clear when the powers of darkness yell against Jesus "Have you come to destroy us?" (Spoiler alert: He has!) [Lk 4:34].

But Jesus does more than just fulfill the prophecies that pointed to him. He does more than simply execute the completion of a promise made millennia before his arrival. Jesus, as the son of God, fulfills the longings of the human heart. As St Augustine said in his famous autobiography: "You stir man to take pleasure in praising you, because you have made us for yourself, and our heart is restless until it rests in you."

The question we must ask ourselves is, "Am I willing to allow Jesus Christ to be the fulfillment of all my desires?" This is important because so often we allow ourselves to accept cheap substitutes for God. The world's

favorite substitutes are money, power, and pleasure of all kinds. None are bad in their own right but each will leave you wanting more if you try to use them to fill the deepest longings of your heart. If we are to truly be made new, we must desire Christ and allow him to fulfill our desire. As St Francis de Sales observed:

"Our hearts have a thirst which cannot be quenched by the pleasures of this mortal life, whereof the most esteemed and highest prized, if moderate, do not satisfy us, and if extreme, suffocate us. Yet we desire them always to be extreme, and they are never such without being excessive, insupportable, hurtful... O wonderful yet dear unrest of man's heart!... Ah! what a union of our hearts shall there be with God there above in heaven, where, after these infinite desires of the true good never assuaged in this world, we shall find the living and powerful source thereof... what a holy and sweet ardour to be united and joined to the plentiful breasts of the All-goodness, either to be altogether absorbed in it, or to have it come entirely into us!"

Let us resolve this day to allow Christ to be the fulfillment of all our desires.

ENGAGEMENT OF THE SENSES

The engagement of the senses has always been an essential element to worship in the Catholic tradition. This engagement, is of course, something we carried over from our Jewish roots as the Old Testament talks of incense, and musical instruments being played before the Lord in worship.

For some reason, those who invoke the "Spirit of Vatican II" (yet, rarely, if ever, possess the ability to cite the actual documents of the Second Vatican Council) often express a desire to "ditch" the "bells and smells" of the Masses of old. Nonetheless the Church of today encourages us to utilize these symbols in worship. As we find in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal. "Incensation is an expression of reverence and of prayer, as is signified in Sacred Scripture (cf. Ps 141:2, Rev 8:3)."

Incense has long been a symbol of a prayer pleasing to God, and of our sacrifice of praise rising to the Father. It should also be noted, that in this age of aromatherapy, frankincense has been noted in several places to have great health benefits such as: Reducing inflammation, improving asthma, and even relieving symptoms of cancer. [A cursory Google search on "benefits of Frankincense" will produce several interesting articles]. On solemn feast days, and during Eucharistic adoration. Incense will continue to be used at St Elizabeth to enhance our worship. Recognizing that there are some who may have concerns, in the future, organic, hypoallergenic incense* will be used and its use will be announced in the bulletin and posted in the church on such occasions.

**Yes, such a thing exists. We are also told that it is gluten-free and assured no animals were harmed in its manufacture.*

COMPROMISO DE LOS SENTIDOS

El compromiso de los sentidos siempre ha sido un elemento esencial para adorar en la tradición católica. Este compromiso, por supuesto, es algo que heredamos de nuestras raíces judías como las conversaciones de incienso del Antiguo Testamento, y los instrumentos musicales que se tocan ante el Señor en la adoración.



Por alguna razón, los que invocan el "Espíritu del Vaticano II" (sin embargo, rara vez, si alguna vez, poseen la capacidad de citar los documentos reales del Concilio Vaticano II) a menudo expresan el deseo de "deshacerse" de las "campanas y olores" de las misas de antaño. No obstante, la Iglesia de hoy nos anima a utilizar estos símbolos en la adoración. Como encontramos en la Instrucción General del Misal Romano. "La incensación es una expresión de reverencia y de oración, como se indica en la Sagrada Escritura (cf. Sal. 141: 2, Ap. 8: 3)".

El incienso ha sido durante mucho tiempo el símbolo de una oración que agrada a Dios y de nuestro sacrificio de alabanza al Padre. También se debe tener en cuenta que en esta era de la aromaterapia, se ha observado que el incienso en varios lugares tiene grandes beneficios para la salud, como: Reducir la inflamación, mejorar el asma e incluso aliviar los síntomas del cáncer. [Una búsqueda superficial en Google sobre "beneficios del incienso" producirá varios artículos interesantes]. En los días de fiesta solemne, y durante la adoración eucarística, se seguirá usando incienso en St. Elizabeth para mejorar nuestra adoración. Reconociendo que hay algunos que pueden tener inquietudes, en el futuro, se utilizará incienso *orgánico e hipoalérgico y su uso se anunciará en el boletín y se publicará en la iglesia en tales ocasiones.* Sí, tal cosa existe. También se nos dice que no contiene gluten y que se aseguró que ningún animal sufrió en su fabricación.

MINISTERIO NUESTRA SEÑORA DE LOURDES "CUANDO ESTABA ENFERMO Y SOLO, ME VISITASTE"

NUESTROS CORAZONES TIENEN SED

Jesús hace la afirmación en el Evangelio de hoy de que él es el "cumplimiento" de la profecía de Isaías. Al hacerlo, Jesús da a conocer que él es el cumplimiento de todos los profetas. Él es el Cristo, él es el mesías. Esto queda mucho más claro cuando los poderes de las tinieblas gritan contra Jesús: "¿Has venido a destruirnos?" [Lc 4:34].

Pero Jesús hace más que simplemente cumplir las profecías que lo señalaron. Él hace más que simplemente cumplir el cumplimiento de una promesa hecha milenios antes de su llegada. Jesús, como hijo de Dios, cumple los anhelos del corazón humano. Como dijo San Agustín en su famosa autobiografía: "Usted alienta al hombre a que se complace en elogiarlo, porque nos has creado para ti y nuestro corazón está inquieto hasta que reposa en ti".

La pregunta que debemos hacernos es: "¿Estoy dispuesto a permitir que Jesucristo sea el cumplimiento de todos mis deseos?" Esto es importante porque muy a menudo nos permitimos aceptar sustitutos baratos para Dios. Los sustitutos favoritos del mundo son el dinero, el poder y el placer de todo tipo. Ninguno es malo por derecho propio, pero cada uno te dejará con ganas de más si intentas usarlos para llenar los anhelos más profundos de tu corazón. Si queremos ser verdaderamente nuevos, debemos desear a Cristo y permitirle que cumpla nuestro deseo. Como observó San Francisco de Sales:

"Nuestros corazones tienen una sed que no puede ser apagada por los placeres de esta vida mortal, de los cuales los más estimados y más apreciados y moderados no nos satisfacen, y los extremos nos sofocan. Sin embargo, deseamos que sean siempre extremos, y nunca son así sin ser excesivo, insostenible, doloroso ... ¡Oh, maravilloso pero querido desasosiego del corazón del hombre! ... ¡Ah! ¡qué unión de nuestros corazones habrá con Dios allí arriba en el cielo, después de estos infinitos deseos de el verdadero bien nunca logrado en este mundo, encontraremos la fuente viva y poderosa del mismo ... qué ardor santo y dulce se unirá y se unirá a los abundantes pechos de la bondad, ya sea para absorberlo por completo, ¡O para que nos llene por completo!

Resolvamos este día que Cristo sea el cumplimiento de todos nuestros deseos.

Statement of the Catholic Bishops of Florida on the 46th Anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*

January 22, 2019

“So great is the value of a human life, and so inalienable the right to life of an innocent child growing in the mother’s womb, that no alleged right to one’s own body can justify a decision to terminate that life, which is an end in itself and which can never be considered the ‘property’ of another human being.”

- Pope Francis, *Amoris Laetitia*, no. 83

On this annual Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, we pray that the Lord enlighten the eyes of our hearts and lead our nation out of the darkness of the decision to legalize abortion 46 years ago. On this anniversary, we pray for those whom we will never know, and we pray for their mothers and fathers who have suffered this loss. We pray for each other that our enlightenment will lead us to honor the sacredness of each life, given to us by God for God.

However, we are encouraged by having celebrated this last year another anniversary – that of *Humanae Vitae* – and the canonization of its author, Saint Pope Paul VI. This prophetic encyclical shook the world 50 years ago with its countercultural instruction rejecting artificial contraception and welcoming children as gifts from God that are part of married love. Yet, today, growing numbers of women of all faiths and no faith are rejecting artificial contraception and realizing that fertility is not a disease to be “treated.” Rather, spouses are discovering natural family planning as it promotes healthy reproduction, healthy relationships, and a healthy environment.

Similarly, we are convinced that the Church’s teaching on abortion is continuously proving to be prophetic. Our nation is increasingly rejecting abortion and *Roe v. Wade* as states continue to adopt more limitations on abortion and expand alternatives to abortion. During the 2018 legislative session, the people of God and others of good will, through the Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops, advocated for the addition of the Florida Pregnancy Care Network to Florida statutes. This legislation better positions a network of over 100 pregnancy support centers across our state to support women who choose life for their unborn children, even when facing an unplanned pregnancy.

Yet, there is still much work to be done. We are appalled at the current “assembly line” approach by abortionists to the irreversible decision of the mother for her and the defenseless child within her womb. While physicians ensure patients are fully informed prior to other serious medical procedures, Florida courts invoked the right to privacy in our state constitution to block a good law requiring a 24-hour reflection period prior to abortion, pending appeal.

The court’s broad interpretation of our state’s privacy clause stems from a Florida Supreme Court ruling in 1989 against a law requiring parental consent prior to a minor’s abortion and poses unique challenges regarding abortion laws in Florida. We advocate for the reconsideration of these decisions, and we remain hopeful that the courts will ultimately protect women in Florida from the predatory practices of the abortion industry. Otherwise, even if *Roe v. Wade* were overturned, the state of Florida could retain permissive abortion policies.

We join together today renewing our cry for an end to everything which denies the sacredness of life, including the unacceptable judicial decision in *Roe v. Wade* and the interpretation of Florida’s privacy clause favoring abortion. We ask God to help us to protect unborn children and their families, and to grant wisdom and courage for those in elected office. May our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our hearts, that we may recognize that devaluing the most innocent and vulnerable life leads to a coarseness and callousness towards one another and all life.
