## GET TO KNOW YOUR SAINTS

# ST. IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

*Feast day: July 31 | Patron of Military and Soldiers, the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), Educators and Education, and sufferers of scrupulosity*

**Birth: 1491 | Death: 1556, Beatified By: July 27, 1609 by Paul V**

Inigo Lopez de Loyola later took the name Ignatius, and he was the youngest son of a nobleman in the Basque region of northern Spain. Inigo was educated and trained in the courtly manner during the reign of King Ferdinand. As a young man, his aspirations and goal were to attain the glory and honor associated with knighthood. Inigo was proud to the point of arrogant, seeking the titles of men and the envy of all.

Upon his birth, Europe was entering the Renaissance period, creating an environment hungry for knowledge, art, and the greater appreciation of discovery and ingenuity. With the Renaissance spirit spurring humanity to extend its discoveries and uncovering civilizations and the “hidden secrets” of nature, “new humanism” spread throughout Europe.



In 1521, attempting to defend the Spanish border fortress of Pamplona against the French artillery, Ignatius' right leg was shattered by a cannon ball. His French captors, impressed by their captor's courage, carried him across Spain to his family home at Loyola. During his convalescence, Ignatius reflected on the books he read about the lives of the saints, and went on to question his former life, asking: “Why can I not walk these same glorious paths as did the saints?” These books and the isolation of the recovery period brought about his conversion. The more he reflected, the more he was convinced that he needed to do penance, and so he resolved to go on pilgrimage to Jerusalem. One evening, perhaps it was mid-August 1521, Our Lady with the Infant Jesus visited him in his room, a visit that brought him much consolation, having prior being in deep disconsolation. This was his night of deeper conversion and transformation; he now detested his former way of life and was determined to follow the paths of the saints. As he continued to read his books, he continued to reflect; and the more he reflected, the more did God become the center of his life.

During this pilgrimage, Ignatius stopped at Manresa. He became familiar with other spiritual books, among them the Imitation of Christ, a book which he always esteemed. Whenever a passage from his reading particularly struck him, he jotted it down in the notebook he carried, the same one in which he recorded his meditations and the illuminations he received in prayer. It was from this little book that the Spiritual Exercises would later emerge.

In September 1529, when he began his studies for priesthood at Sainte-Barbe, Ignatius shared a room with Peter Faber and Francis Xavier (also saints). In time he explained to them how he intended to spend his life for the salvation of souls. Faber, having the same aspirations, became Ignatius first recruit. Xavier, however, still had dreams of worldly success, and it took time before Ignatius won him over. Among their friends at the university there were other Spaniards who also desired to consecrate themselves to God in the priesthood and in the service of souls. When he felt his recruits were ready, he directed each of them through the Spiritual Exercises. The result was that each one was now more committed to God than he had been before. In March, in preparation for their trip to the Holy Land, Ignatius sent his men to Rome to seek papal permission for their pilgrimage and to request ordination for the non-priests among them. # CONOCE A TUS SANTOS SAN IGNACIO DE LOYOLA

*Fiesta: 31 de julio | Patrono de militares y soldados, la Compañía de Jesús (Jesuitas), educadores, educación, y víctimas de la escrupulosidad*

Nacimiento: 1491 | Muerte: 1556 **Beatificado por: 27 de julio de 1609 por Pablo V**  
Canonizado por: 12 de marzo de 1622 por Gregorio XV

Íñigo López de Loyola más tarde tomó el nombre de Ignacio, y él era el hijo más joven de un noble en la región vasca del norte de España. Íñigo fue educado y entrenado de manera cortesana durante el reinado del rey Fernando. Cuando era joven, sus aspiraciones y su objetivo eran alcanzar la gloria y el honor asociados con la caballería. Íñigo estaba orgulloso hasta el punto de arrogante, buscando los títulos de los hombres y la envidia de todos. Sobre su nacimiento, Europa estaba entrando en el período del Renacimiento, creando un ambiente con hambre de conocimiento, arte y una mayor apreciación del descubrimiento y el ingenio. Con el espíritu renacentista estimulando a la humanidad a extender sus descubrimientos y descubrir civilizaciones y los "secretos ocultos" de la naturaleza, el "nuevo humanismo" se extendió por toda Europa.



En 1521, intentando defender la fortaleza fronteriza española de Pamplona contra la artillería francesa, la pierna derecha de Ignacio fue destrozada por una bala de cañón. Sus captores franceses, impresionados por el coraje de su captor, lo llevaron a través de España a su casa familiar en Loyola. Durante su convalecencia, Ignacio reflexionó sobre los libros que leyó acerca de la vida de los santos, y luego cuestionó su vida anterior, y preguntó: "¿Por qué no puedo caminar por estos mismos caminos gloriosos como lo hicieron los santos?" Estos libros y el aislamiento del período de recuperación provocaron su conversión.

Cuanto más reflexionaba, más se convencía de que tenía que hacer penitencia, así que resolvió ir en peregrinación a Jerusalén. Una noche, tal vez fue a mediados de agosto de 1521, Nuestra Señora con el Niño Jesús lo visitó en su habitación, una visita que le proporcionó gran consuelo, ya que había estado en profunda desconsolación. Esta fue su noche de conversión y transformación más profunda; ahora detestaba su antigua forma de vida y estaba decidido a seguir los caminos de los santos. Mientras continuaba leyendo sus libros, continuó reflexionando; y cuanto más reflexionaba, más se convertía Dios en el centro de su vida.

Durante esta peregrinación, Ignacio se detuvo en Manresa. Se familiarizó con otros libros espirituales, entre ellos la Imitación de Cristo, un libro que siempre estimó. Cada vez que un pasaje de su lectura lo golpeaba particularmente, lo anotaba en el cuaderno que llevaba, el mismo en el que registraba sus meditaciones y las iluminaciones que recibía en oración. De este pequeño libro surgieron los Ejercicios Espirituales.

En septiembre de 1529, cuando comenzó sus estudios para el sacerdocio en Sainte-Barbe, Ignacio compartió una habitación con Peter Faber y Francis Xavier (también santos). Con el tiempo les explicó cómo pensaba pasar su vida trabajando por la salvación de las almas. Faber, teniendo las mismas aspiraciones, se convirtió en el primer recluta de Ignacio. Xavier, sin embargo, todavía tenía sueños de éxito mundano, y tomó tiempo antes de que Ignacio lo ganara. Entre sus amigos en la universidad había otros españoles que también deseaban consagrarse a Dios en el sacerdocio y al servicio de las almas. Cuando sintió que sus reclutas estaban listos, los dirigió a cada uno de ellos a través de los Ejercicios Espirituales. El resultado fue que cada uno estaba ahora más comprometido con Dios de lo que había estado antes.



En Marzo, en preparación para su viaje a Tierra Santa, Ignacio envió a sus hombres a Roma para solicitar permiso papal para su peregrinación y para pedir la ordenación de los no sacerdotes entre ellos. Se encontraron con el Papa Pablo III el 3 de abril, martes de Pascua. El Papa, muy impresionado por este grupo altamente educado, no solo concedió permiso para su peregrinación propuesta y para la ordenación de los que aún no eran sacerdotes, sino que incluso les dio dinero para su pasaje a Jerusalén. Ignacio y los demás decidieron que a su regreso, serían ordenados. A su regreso a Venecia, volvieron a su trabajo de voluntarios en los hospitales. El 14 de junio de 1537, Ignacio y otros cuatro fueron ordenados sacerdotes.

En Septiembre llamó a sus compañeros a Vicenza para discutir planes, cuyo resultado fue que el Pd. Ignacio debía ir a Roma y ofrecer los servicios del grupo al Papa, mientras que los otros debían ir a varios centros universitarios donde comenzarían su apostolado de predicación. Se determinó un punto final: si alguien les preguntara quiénes eran, responderían a la "Compañía de Jesús". Se llamaron Compañía de Jesús, pero cuando se convirtió en latín se convirtió en Societas Jesu, y cuando se traduce al inglés se convierte en la conocida Society of Jesus. Los Ejercicios Espirituales de San Ignacio son ricos porque tocan todas las dimensiones que nos hacen humanos: físicos, emocionales y espirituales. Él ejemplifica que uno puede obtener santidad sin importar sus antecedentes, circunstancias pasadas o presentes. La conversión de San Ignacio revela que la apertura a Dios alimenta nuestra determinación, confiando en la presencia activa y amorosa de Dios incluso cuando somos más conscientes de nuestra debilidad y quebrantamiento. Su coraje y determinación para dejar su vida anterior para entrar en una vida en / con Jesucristo es una gran razón para conocer a este santo.

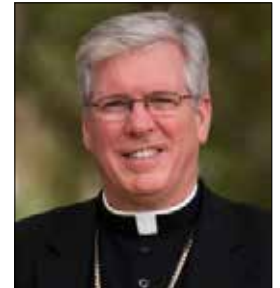
# DIOCESAN STEWARDSHIP DAY

Pope Paul III on April 3, Easter Tuesday. The pope, greatly impressed by this highly-educated group, not only granted permission for their proposed pilgrimage and for the ordination of those who were not yet priests, but he even gave them money for their passage to Jerusalem. Ignatius and the others decided that upon their return, they would be ordained. On their return to Venice, they went back to their volunteer work at the hospitals. On June 14, 1537, Ignatius and four others were ordained priests.

In September he called his companions to Vicenza to discuss plans, the outcome of which was that Fr. Ignatius was to go to Rome and offer the services of the group to the Pope, while the others were to go to various university centers where they were to begin their preaching apostolate. One final item was determined: if anyone should ask them who they were, they would answer the "Company of Jesus." They called themselves *Compañía de Jesús*, but when that was rendered into Latin it became *Societas Jesu*, and when this is translated into English it becomes the familiar *Society of Jesus*. St. Ignatius' Spiritual Exercises are rich because they touch all the dimensions that make us human: physical, emotional, and spiritual. He exemplifies that one can obtain holiness no matter her/his background, past, or present circumstances. St. Ignatius' conversion discloses that openness to God fuels our determination, trusting in God's active and loving presence in even when we are most aware of our weakness and brokenness. His courage and determination to leave his former life to enter a life in/with Jesus Christ is a great reason for us getting to know this saint.
