

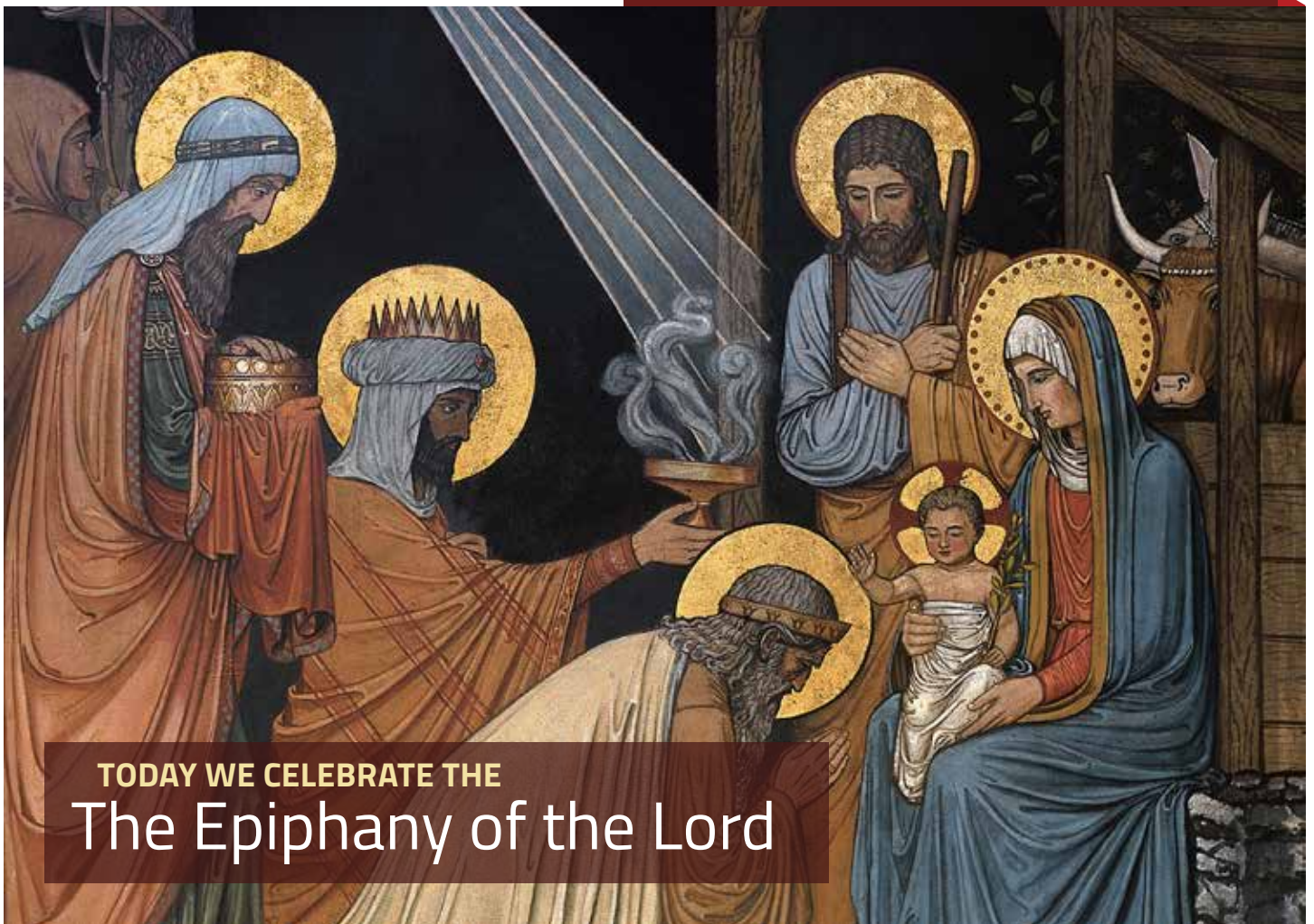

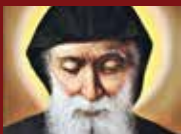

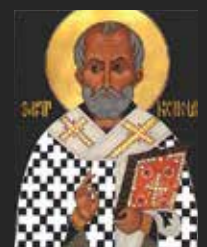

“HOME BY ANOTHER WAY”

There is a song by James Taylor entitled “Home By Another Way” that is a reflection on the visit of the Magi to the Christ Child, which we celebrate today. The song looks at one aspect of the story of the Kings from the East often overlooked, which is the last verse of today’s Gospel: “And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.” (Matthew 2:12). The Magi had an encounter with Christ. They had an epiphany, an awakening, and having found the one who was the fulfillment of all their desires, they had no choice but to change. They could not go home the same way as they came, because they were not the same men as they were when they came.

If you look into the teachings of Pope Francis you will find a frequent theme being changed by an encounter with Christ, as he once tweeted “Each encounter with Jesus changes our life.” In this spirit, the Holy Father once suggested a good prayer for us to pray is: “Lord, when did I consciously find you? When did you tell me something that changed my life or invited me to take that step forward in life?”. The celebration of Epiphany tells us that there is one week left in the Liturgical season of Christmas. So as we have celebrated the event of our Lord’s birth among us, and as we begin a new calendar year, it’s good to ask ourselves “In what ways have I allowed the Lord to change me this year?” Or, “How has meeting the Lord sent me ‘Home by Another Way?’”

TODAY WE CELEBRATE THE FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD

The Epiphany of Our Lord is the Christian feast observed on Jan. 6, 2016. The word “epiphany” comes from the Greek epiphainen, a verb that means “to shine upon,” “to manifest,” or “to make known.” Thus, the feast of the Epiphany celebrates the many ways that Christ has made Himself known to the world, mainly the three events that manifested the mission and divinity of Christ: the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12), the baptism of Jesus (Mark 1:9-11), and the miracle at Cana (John 2:1-11). The visit of the Magi is emphasized on Epiphany Day, and Christ’s baptism is celebrated the first Sunday that follows.

The feast of the Epiphany, which was kept in the East and in certain Western Churches before being observed in Rome, seems to have been originally a feast of the nativity; January 6, for those churches where it was kept, was the equivalent of Christmas (December 25) in the Roman Church. The feast was introduced at Rome in the second half of the sixth century and became the complement and, so to say, the crown of the Christmas festival.



Epiphany means manifestation. What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. Christian tradition has ever seen in the Magi the first fruits of the Gentiles; they lead in their wake all the peoples of the earth, and thus the Epiphany is an affirmation of universal salvation. St. Leo brings out this point admirably in a sermon, read at Matins, in which he shows in the adoration of the Magi the beginnings of Christian faith, the time when the great mass of the heathen sets off to follow the star which summons it to seek its Saviour.

That is the meaning, too, of the wonderful prophecy from Isaias which the liturgy appoints to be read in the first nocturn at Matins and at the Epistle of the Mass. This same thought of universal redemption the Church returns to as she sings, in the antiphon to the Magnificat at 2nd Vespers, applying the words to herself, of the union with Christ typified by the wedding feast at Cana, by the baptism of her children foreshadowed by that of Christ in the waters of the Jordan. Formerly the Epiphany was an additional day for solemn baptisms.

LATIN CHANT: TRANSCENDING CULTURE AND LANGUAGE IN MASS

For the past couple of years, it has been the custom at St. Elizabeth Seton, as is often done at parishes in the United States, to use Latin Chants during seasons of preparation, namely Advent and Lent. We do this in the spirit of the Second Vatican Council, which tells us in the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy: "the use of the Latin language is to be preserved" (36) and further, "steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them." (53)



Also the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, published in 2010, observed "Since the faithful from different countries come together ever more frequently, it is desirable that they know how to sing together at least some parts of the Ordinary of the Mass in Latin"(41) We here at St. Elizabeth Seton have a linguistically and ethnically diverse community. Learning parts of the Sacred Liturgy in the universal language (Latin) and preferred music (Gregorian Chant) of the Church give us an opportunity to transcend language and culture as we approach the holiest times of the year.
