

THE LENTEN FAST

"This kind [of demon] cannot be driven out by anything but prayer and fasting." (Mark 9:29)
In these words from the Gospel of Mark, Jesus explains that for effective ministry one must pray and fast. Fasting is one of the pillars of this great season of Lent, the others being prayer and almsgiving. In the early Church, fasting was almost inseparable from prayer; the two went hand-in-hand. Fasting was seen as a way to remind us of our reliance on God, as opposed to a false sense of self-sufficiency.

By fasting, we grow closer to the Lord. Fasting is not a Catholic diet, nor is it something we do to show how spiritually tough we are, we do it so that we may recall how much God loves and cares for us. It gives us a taste of the suffering Jesus endured for our salvation, and ultimately allows us to unite in the prayer, fasting, and sacrifice of Jesus, as the old Lenten Hymn reminds us "for Christ, through whom all things were made, himself has fasted and has prayed."



Practically, this is what fasting looks like for a Catholic: It is the fourth precept of the Church to "observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church." For a Catholic, the minimum is to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, we are to keep the Good Friday fast through Holy Saturday. This means that we could take two small meals (snacks) to keep our strength along with one full meal on these two days. This precept is for all Catholics age 18 to age 59 (of course those with medical conditions are not bound). Along with fasting, Catholics over the age of 14 are required to abstain from meat on all Fridays of the year, not just Lenten Fridays (Code of Canon Law, 1251). However, outside the season of Lent, a Catholic in the United States is free to choose an alternate penance on Fridays as opposed to the abstinence from meat (Pastoral Statement on Penance and Abstinence, United States Catholic Bishops, 1964). We do this on Fridays to recall, in a special way, the sacrifice of Christ who gave his flesh for our life, we recall his sacrifice by abstaining from the flesh of animals.

Fasting and abstaining from meat are just two of the ways, along with prayer and acts of mercy, by which we are called to grow in our relation to the Lord. In the season of Lent we are also called to other forms of self-denial, to "give up" things for Lent as well as to enter more deeply into prayer and reach out to others. Fasting is a powerful way to grow close to the Lord by self-denial, it also helps us to rely more on the Lord for his grace, and if done right, unites us to the passion of Jesus Christ. Let us fast and pray for peace in our world, justice in our community and for the Kingdom of God to reign in our hearts!

EL AYUNO EN CUARESMA

"Este tipo [de demonio] solo puede ser expulsado con oración y ayuno". (Marcos 9:29)

En estas palabras del Evangelio de Marcos, Jesús explica que para un ministerio ser efectivo uno debe rezar y ayunar. El ayuno es uno de los pilares de esta gran temporada de Cuaresma, los otros son oración y limosna. En la Iglesia primitiva, el ayuno era casi inseparable de la oración; las dos iban de la mano. El ayuno fue visto como una manera de recordarnos nuestra confianza en Dios, oponiéndose a un falso sentido de autosuficiencia.

Al ayunar, nos acercamos más al Señor. El ayuno no es una dieta católica, ni es algo que nosotros hacemos para mostrar cuán fuertes somos espiritualmente, lo hacemos para que podamos recordar cuánto nos ama Dios y nos cuida. Nos da una idea del sufrimiento que Jesús soportó por nuestra salvación y en última instancia, nos permite unirnos en la oración, el ayuno y el sacrificio de Jesús, como en la antigua Cuaresma.

El himno nos recuerda "para Cristo, a través de quien todas las cosas fueron hechas, él mismo ha ayunado y ha orado".



Prácticamente, así es como se ve el ayuno para un católico: es el cuarto precepto de la Iglesia. "observar los días de ayuno y abstinencia establecidos por la Iglesia". Para un católico, lo mínimo es ayunar el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. Si es posible,

debemos mantener el ayuno el Viernes Santo hasta el Sábado Santo. Esto significa que podríamos tomar dos comidas pequeñas (bocadillos) para mantener nuestra fuerza junto con una comida completa en estos dos días. Este precepto es para todos los católicos de 18 a 59 años (por supuesto, aquellos con afecciones médicas no están vinculados). De la mano del ayuno, los católicos mayores de 14 años deben abstenerse de comer carne todos los viernes del año, no solo los viernes de Cuaresma (Código de Derecho Canónico, 1251). Sin embargo, fuera de temporada de Cuaresma, un católico en los Estados Unidos es libre de elegir una penitencia alternativa los Viernes opuesta a la abstinencia de la carne (Declaración pastoral sobre la penitencia y la abstinencia, Obispos Católicos de Estados Unidos, 1964). Se hace los viernes para recordar, de manera especial, el sacrificio de Cristo que dio su carne por nuestra vida, recordamos su sacrificio al abstenernos de la carne de los animales.

Ayunar y abstenerse de comer carne son solo dos de las formas, junto con la oración y los actos de misericordia, por la cual somos llamados a crecer en nuestra relación con el Señor. En la temporada de Cuaresma nosotros también somos llamados a otras formas de abnegación a "renunciar" a las cosas para la Cuaresma, así como a entrar más profundamente en la oración y llegar a los demás. El ayuno es una forma poderosa de acercarse al Señor por la negación propia, también nos ayuda a confiar más en el Señor por su gracia si se hace bien, nos une a la pasión de Jesucristo. Ayunemos y oremos por la paz en nuestro mundo, ¡justicia en nuestra comunidad y para que el Reino de Dios reine en nuestros corazones!



COLLEGE PLANNING SEMINAR



LATIN CHANT: TRANSCENDING CULTURE AND LANGUAGE IN MASS

For the past couple of years, it has been the custom at St. Elizabeth Seton, as is often done at parishes in the United States, to use Latin Chants during seasons of preparation, namely Advent and Lent. We do this in the spirit of the Second Vatican Council, which tells us in the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy: "the use of the Latin language is to be preserved" (36) and further, "steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them." (53)



Also, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, published in 2010, observed "Since the faithful from different countries come together ever more frequently, it is desirable that they know how to sing together at least some parts of the Ordinary of the Mass in Latin"(41) We, here at St. Elizabeth Seton, have a linguistically and ethnically diverse community. Learning parts of the Sacred Liturgy in the universal language (Latin) and preferred music (Gregorian Chant) of the Church gives us an opportunity to transcend language and culture as we approach the holiest times of the year.


