# RETHINKING PARISH HOSPITALITY

There is an ancient axiom used by the Benedictine Order: *Hospes venit, Christus venit*. That is to say, when the guest comes, Christ comes. This was a motto applied to those seeking shelter in monasteries, but it is a motto, which I strongly believe should be applied to any parish, but in particular, ours.

Let's face it, friends, by-and-by Catholic Churches are not known for being welcoming communities (though I do feel like we are far better than average here at SES). Imagine for one moment that you had no connection whatsoever with the Catholic Church, and found yourself in our space on Sunday morning. Would you know where to park and where to enter the Church? Assuming you found your way in, would you be greeted? Would someone help you find a place to sit? Would you endure snarls from some, if you sat in "their" seat? Would you find the liturgy itself intimidating with all of its movements, gestures, and responses? Would anyone go out of their way to make you feel at home? It seems that it's time to rethink hospitality in our parish, and I think it's time to go outside the box.

Having made this statement, I would like to personally invite anyone who is passionate about making people feel welcome to join our new ministry. **We will call this new ministry "CV" - for *Christus Venit* - to remind us who we are welcoming.** We are looking forward to CV being a large ministry composed of several CV teams including: A parking team to help get people settled in the parking lot and get into the Church building. A host team that will welcome and offer to help seat everyone who



walks through the doors. Another group will be at a table in the vestibule to help answer questions people may have about the parish, and to help them register should they like, and also a team of people who would be willing to sit with someone unfamiliar with the Catholic Mass to help them feel at home with a ritual that is foreign to them. **If you are interested in this ministry of hospitality, please contact myself or Hector Salazar (contact info on opposite page).** Let's work together to be good hosts and make people feel welcome here at St. Elizabeth Seton. Together, we will welcome Christ in our parish.

# EASTER AND THE VICTORY OF LIFE

Easter celebrates the victory of LIFE. Christians do not come to Church on Easter simply to congratulate Jesus for rising from the dead. They come in order to touch their own victory over death.

In rising, Christ destroyed not only His own death, but ours! He overturned the entire kingdom of death. Death has no more power over Him; nor does it have ultimate power over those who live in Him. The influence of the Church on the world, therefore, is the influence of a community which already participates in victory over death. That influence moves the choices of society away from death and destruction, and toward the affirmation, in word and deed, of the precious gift of LIFE.

The victory of LIFE has already been won, but has not yet fully unfolded. We therefore rejoice and struggle at the same time. We have unshakeable confidence that the power of LIFE is greater than the forces of death. Yet we must not relax our efforts to protect God's gift of LIFE from the culture of death which surrounds us.

**Easter Pro-life Prayer** *Lord Jesus Christ, we praise your Resurrection! We celebrate your triumph over the Kingdom of death! May we, your Church, proclaim, celebrate, and serve the victory of LIFE in our world. May we respond to the needs of those who are tempted to destroy the LIFE within them by abortion, and may we help to build a world which rejects every form of violence and in particular, the violence of abortion. You live and reign forever and ever. Amen.*



# MAGNITUDE AND SCOPE OF ABORTION

The US has lost about 1.2 million soldiers in all of its wars since the Declaration of Independence in 1776. In a much shorter time since 1973, we have killed about 50 times as many pre-born babies. Also, abortion has cost the US about 120 times as much as all American wars have.

Who could have predicted this wide scale slaughter of innocent life that goes on, day in day out? Who would have guessed that abortion would be de-criminalized, protected by governments and proudly promoted and funded by governments and corporations?

Who would have guessed that some schools and colleges would promote this, imagined that churches would remain silent and that school officials can and do send minors for abortions without parental consent? Who would have guessed that the media moguls would despise and oppose all who valiantly come to the defense of innocent life?

How did we get to this position? How did we become so callous and how can "civilized" people consider their God given children as disposable? There is nothing in human history to equal this massive slaughter.

Why do we not do more to prevent abortion? Lord, have mercy on us.



# ST. ELIZABETH SETON IS CURRENTLY SEEKING A DIRECTOR OF YOUTH MINISTRY

St. Elizabeth Seton Parish is currently seeking a dynamic, faith-filled and qualified disciple of Jesus Christ to serve full-time as Director of Youth Ministry.

The Director of Youth Ministry will report to the Director of Faith Formation under the guidance and direction of the Pastor/Administrator. The DYM will be responsible for designing, implementing planning, scheduling, coordinating, and conducting discipleship-centered programs for middle school, high school students, as well as young adults within the parish.

The parish envisions a youth ministry with dynamic and relevant programming, yet at the center would be the formation of discipleship communities, founded on relational ministry. A commitment to missionary endeavors, going out into "the peripheries" of community to reach those not currently engaged with the Church is essential.

The DYM will also be responsible to organize, recruit, train, and lead adult volunteers (Core Team) to assist in planning and running of Youth Ministry Programs.

The DYM walks with young people to become active Disciples of Jesus Christ who fully participate in all aspects of parish life. This is accomplished through a process of evangelization that includes pastoral, liturgical and catechetical formation as well as service opportunities. The DYM will also serve as a resource and support to and work in conjunction with other parish ministries, including the parish school.

- Emotionally mature individual, confident in ability to work with youth and adults for fostering the Catholic faith.
- Bachelor's degree in theology or related field, with some experience in the field of youth ministry preferred.
- Creative with excellent skills for prioritizing and organizing.
- Skilled in both written and oral communication, including presentations to small and large groups.
- Proficient in Microsoft Office Suite and fluent in applications used by our youth.
- The ideal candidate will also be bilingual in English and Spanish


