



SIT DOWN. BE HUMBLE.

Jesus, not unlike Kendrick Lamar, reminds us of the need to be humble: "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted." (Lk 4:15). Humility is not a word that gets anyone excited. It's etymology (from the latin *humo acclinis*) literally means to be low to the ground. Aquinas defines it as "chiefly the subjection of man to God, for whose sake he humbles himself by subjecting himself to others." To be humble is to submit to the will of God. To know who God is and to know who I am is to be humble. Humility can be painful because it stands in direct contradiction to pride, which is ordinal sin.



I recently read some thoughts of St. Bernard of Clairveaux who provides us with the steps to humility and the steps to pride. This chart is sure to convict us all:

Steps into Pride

1. Curiosity about what is not one's proper concern
2. Light mindedness: chatter and exclamation about things which do not matter
3. Laughing about nothing; foolish merriment
4. Boasting and talking too much
5. Trying to be different: claiming special rights
6. Thinking oneself holier than others
7. Interfering presumptuously with the affairs of others
8. Self-justification: defending one's sinful actions
9. Insincere confession
10. Rebellng against superiors
11. Feeling free to sin
12. Habitual sinning

Steps into Humility

12. Containment of one's interests, which shows itself in a humble bearing and lowered eyes
11. Quiet and restrained speech
10. Reluctance to laugh
9. Keeping silent unless asked to speak
8. Regarding oneself as having no special rights in the community
7. Thinking oneself less holy than the others
6. Thinking oneself unworthy to take initiative
5. Confessing one's sins
4. Patience in the face of accusation
3. Submission to superiors
2. Desiring no freedom to exercise one's will
1. Constant watchfulness against sin

Now, we have to put these in proper context. These steps were written for eleventh century Cistercian monks who lived a strict life, and not all of the "steps to pride" are sinful. Please don't stop reading this and think that it is a sin to laugh, be merry, or talk. But how many times in my life have I laughed at something that I don't find funny for the sake of the esteem of others? How often do I regard what I have to say as more important than another? When we learn to humble ourselves before others, it is much easier to humble ourselves before God.

DO YOU KNIT OR CROCHET?



SIÉNTATE. SE HUMILDE.

Jesús, a diferencia de Kendrick Lamar, nos recuerda la necesidad de ser humildes: "Porque todo el que se ensalza será humillado y el que se humilla será enaltecido" (Lc 4,15). Humildad no es una palabra que entusiasma a nadie. Es etimología (del latín *acclinis humo*) significa literalmente estar cerca del suelo. Tomás de Aquino lo define como "principalmente la sujeción del hombre a Dios, por cuyo bien se humilla sometiéndose a los demás". Ser humilde es someterse a la voluntad de Dios. Saber quién es Dios y saber quién soy yo, es ser humilde. La humildad puede ser dolorosa porque está en contradicción directa con el orgullo, que es el pecado ordinal.



Hace poco leí algunos pensamientos de San Bernardo de Clarveaux, que nos proporciona los pasos a la humildad y los pasos al orgullo. Este cuadro seguramente nos condenará a todos:

Pasos hacia el orgullo

1. Curiosidad acerca de lo que no es una preocupación propia
2. Mentalidad ligera: charla y exclamación sobre cosas que no importan.
3. Riéndose de nada; alegría tonta
4. Jactarse y hablar demasiado
5. Intentar ser diferente: reclamar derechos especiales
6. Creerse más santo que los demás.
7. Interferir presuntuosamente con los asuntos de los demás.
8. Autojustificación: defender las acciones pecaminosas
9. Confesión no sincera
10. Rebelándose contra los superiores.
11. Sentirse libre para pecar
12. Pecado habitual

Pasos hacia la humildad

12. Contención de los propios intereses, que se muestra con un porte humilde y ojos bajos.
11. Discurso tranquilo y moderado.
10. Renuencia a reír
9. Guardar silencio a menos que se le pida hablar
8. Considerarse a sí mismo como no tener derechos especiales en la comunidad
7. Pensarse menos santo que los demás.
6. Pensarse indigno de tomar la iniciativa.
5. Confesar los propios pecados.
4. Paciencia ante la acusación.
3. Sumisión a los superiores
2. Deseando no tener libertad para ejercer la voluntad
1. Vigilancia constante contra el pecado.

Por favor, no dejes de leer esto no pienses que es pecado reír, alegrarte o hablar. ¿cuántas veces en mi vida me he reído de algo que no me parece gracioso por amor a los demás? ¿Con qué frecuencia considero que lo que tengo que decir es más importante que lo del otro? Cuando aprendemos a humillarnos ante los demás, es mucho más fácil humillarnos ante Dios.



OUT AND ABOUT THE DIOCESE

Priesthood Sunday - This year, throughout the United States, Priesthood Sunday takes place on Sunday, September 29, 2019. This day is set aside for all to reflect upon and affirm the vocation of the Priesthood as a central role in the life of the Church. Priesthood Sunday is an opportunity to show gratitude to our priests who serve the faithful tirelessly throughout the year, and who are instrumental in conferring the Holy Sacraments.

Prayers Needed - Pope Francis recently approved a miracle attributed to Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, making possible his beatification. The Vatican Congregation for the Causes of Saints promulgated the decree approving Archbishop Sheen’s miracle on July 6. A WELL-FORMED CONSCIENCE

The Church equips its members to address political and social questions by helping them to develop a well-formed conscience. Catholics have a serious and lifelong obligation to form their consciences in accord with human reason and the teaching of the Church. Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere "feeling" about what we should or should not do. Rather, conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil.

Conscience always requires serious attempts to make sound moral judgments based on the truths of our faith. As stated in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Conscience is a judgement of reason whereby the human person recognizes the moral quality of a concrete act that he is going to perform, is in the process of performing, or has already completed. In all he says and does, man is obliged to follow faithfully what he knows to be just and right".



SAVE THE DAY VOLUNTEER NURSES NEEDED

Community Pregnancy Clinics is a unique pregnancy resource center which provides many services to women, including Pregnancy Testing, Limited Obstetric Ultrasound Exam, STI Screening, Caring Peer Counseling & Referral Services, free of charge, using a professional medical model and full-time licensed medical staff. We are dedicated to providing quality care, compassion, and choices as we work to help moms and save babies from abortion.

We need nurses to help us with this mission. We are looking for nurses who are registered in the state of Florida to assist with one shift per week or more in our Mobile Medical Clinic, which travels to many locations between Naples and Port Charlotte. 
