# 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT: DO NOT BE AFRAID... GREAT TIDINGS OF JOY.

Here we are in the fourth and last week of Advent, getting ready for Christmas. I imagine a lot of us are anxiously preparing for the holiday. Even in the church, we're trying to figure out how to best serve our people with all the different festivities around Christmas. It's easy to forget what Christmas is all about. It is about our salvation. It is about a God who loves us and who came among us, and we begin to hear the gospel narratives. The narratives all start the same way - with the birth of Jesus.

The Angel said, "DO NOT BE AFRAID". In fact, "do not be afraid" appears in the scripture 266 times. It is like the Lord knew that we needed to hear it more than once per day. It is good for us to remember that. What does Jesus Christ bring? Jesus Christ brings God. In one of my favorite books "Jesus of Nazareth" by Pope Benedict XVI, he stated Christ came to bring peace, but it seemed that there is not peace in the world. There is still oppression, hardship and political unrest. There are still starving children and there is still me in the midst of my own life and my own conditions. So, what did Jesus bring us - GOD. Jesus brings us God, a God that enters into our reality.



He did not distance himself from us, but comes and acts and walks and talks among us. The joy of the incarnation of Jesus Christ is a mystery that is exclusive to Christianity. Nowhere else is there a God who actually takes on our flesh. When I think about that, it brings me inner peace. It brings me a sense of safety, a sense of security in knowing there is a God who loves me more than I can possibly imagine.

So, this week as Christmas approaches, really allow yourself to encounter that Jesus. Place yourself in these gospel stories. Walk alongside Mary and Joseph. Place yourself in their shoes and feel the same trepidation, the same fear, the same anxiety that they felt. But hear the voice of that angelic messenger coming to me and to you " DO NOT BE AFRAID FOR I BRING YOU GOOD NEWS AND TIDINGS OF GREAT JOY!"

## ADVENT: EXPECTANT DELIGHT FOR THE COMING OF THE LORD

The Season of Advent is an invitation to pause in silence to recognize the signs of the coming of the presence of the Lord. Advent has a two-fold character, it is a time of preparation for the Solemnity of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight (Universal Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar, 39). "During Advent we do not just live in anticipation of Christmas; we are also called to rekindle the anticipation of the glorious return of Christ — when he will return at the end of time — preparing ourselves, with consistent and courageous choices, for the final encounter with him. We remember Christmas, we await the glorious return of Christ, and also our personal encounter: the day in which the Lord will call." -Pope Francis

# NO TENGAS MIEDO POR QUE EL TRAE BUENAS NOTICIAS

Aquí estamos en la cuarta y última semana de Adviento preparándonos para Navidad. Me imagino que muchos de nosotros nos estamos preparando ansiosamente para las fiestas. Incluso en la iglesia estamos tratando de encontrar la mejor manera de servir a nuestra gente con todas las diferentes festividades alrededor de Navidad. Es fácil olvidar de qué se trata la Navidad. Se trata de nuestra salvación. Se trata de un Dios que nos ama y que vino entre nosotros. Cuando comenzamos a escuchar las narraciones del Evangelio. Todas las narraciones comienzan de la misma manera, con el nacimiento de Jesús. El ángel dijo: "NO TENGAS MIEDO". De hecho, "no tengas miedo" aparece en la escritura 266 veces. Es como si el Señor supiera que necesitamos escucharlo más de una vez al día. Es bueno para nosotros recordar eso. ¿Qué nos trae Jesucristo? Jesucristo trae a Dios.

En uno de mis libros favoritos, Jesús de Nazaret, del Papa Benedicto XVI, dijo que Cristo vino a traer la paz, pero parece que no hay paz en el mundo. Todavía hay opresión, dificultades y disturbios políticos. Todavía hay niños hambrientos y todavía estoy yo en medio de mi propia vida y mis propias condiciones. Entonces, ¿qué nos trajo Jesucristo? Jesús nos trae a Dios, un Dios que entra en nuestra realidad. No se distanció de nosotros, sino que viene, actúa, camina y habla entre nosotros. La alegría de la encarnación de Jesús es un misterio exclusivo del cristianismo. En ningún otro lugar hay un Dios que realmente tome nuestra carne. Cuando pienso en eso, me trae paz interior.

Me da una sensación de seguridad, una sensación de seguridad al saber que hay un Dios que me ama más de lo que puedo imaginar. Así es que esta semana, en que se acerca la Navidad, permítete realmente encontrarte con Jesús, colocarte en estas historias del evangelio. Camina junto a María y Jose. Ponte en su lugar y siente la misma inquietud, el mismo miedo, la misma ansiedad que ellos sintieron. Pero escucha la voz de ese mensajero angelical que viene hacia mí y hacia tí "NO TENGAS MIEDO POR QUE EL TRAE BUENAS NOTICIAS, NOTICIAS DE GRAN ALEGRÍA".
